## Flower Planting Event Honors Victims of Abuse



The City Attorney's Office Victim Assistance Program, in partnership with the Casa Grande Elementary School District, hosted a flower planting event in October as part of National Domestic Violence Awareness Month.

The flower garden in front of City Hall is planted every year to remember children who have been victims of abuse. Victims' Rights Specialist and event organizer Terry Montijo says, "Children are a huge priority for us. We see an alarming trend in cases where children have been exposed to violence in their home. In those cases where children are traumatized or develop emotional and behavioral problems, we bring resources to parents to help alleviate the effects of violence on their children."



The schools that participated this year were Cactus Middle School, Cholla Elementary, Ironwood Elementary, Palo Verde Elementary, Saguaro Elementary, and the Villago Middle School Verde Club. This year's special event was sponsored by The Groundskeeper: Outside Solutions.

Against Abuse, Inc. also participated in the event by planting pinwheels to promote awareness of child abuse prevention.

"It's important to educate our youth about the signs and types of abuse," says Montijo. "There are many types of abuse, including physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect and emotional maltreatment. We want parents and children to understand the different types of abuse and know that we're here to help."

## Pinal Avenue Improvements Underway



The Arizona Department of Transportation (ADOT) is making roadway and sidewalk improvements along a 2.6 mile section of State Route 387 (Pinal Avenue) between Florence Blvd. and Santa Cruz Wash Bridge. The project also includes the installation of a new pedestrian hybrid beacon at the San Carlos Trail school crossing. A pedestrian hybrid beacon is a pedestrian-activated warning device that assists pedestrians in crossing a street at a marked, but un signaled, crosswalk using a system of warning and flashing lights to notify and stop traffic.

## New Shade Structure at Albert Cruz Park

Children who visit Albert Cruz Park on the west side of the city can now play under a shade structure, all thanks to Seeds of Hope and Cenpatico of Arizona. The non-profit organizations donated \$10,519 to build a shade structure over the existing playground equipment for children to recreate under.

The Seeds of Hope Mondo Anaya Community Center is located at Albert Cruz Park and provides a number of resources to the community, including English as a Second Language classes for adults, an after-school program for children, and a support group for parents raising their grandchildren. Seeds of Hope Executive Director Mark Vanderheyden says the Mondo Anaya Community Center serves an average of 200 people in the community. He says over 20 children visit the playground next to the facility daily.

"We had conversations with our neighbors surrounding the park and they expressed the need for a shade structure over the existing play area for their children to use throughout the year," says Vanderheyden. "As a display of appreciation to the City of Casa Grande and for the well-being of the children in the surrounding area, we applied and received a grant from Cenpatico for the shade structure." ## Council Member Ralph Varela Receives Valle del Sol Award

Casa Grande City Council Member Ralph Varela was awarded a Special Recognition Award by the Valle del Sol organization. The Phoenix-based organization presented Varela with the award during their Profiles of Success Hispanic Leadership Awards Celebration. The awards program recognizes and honors individuals who have demonstrated outstanding leadership service to the community and achievements to the state.



Varela is chief executive officer of the Pinal Hispanic Council, a non-profit behavioral health organization. He was selected for the award because of his support for the community and his efforts chairing the annual dinner for the Cesar E. Chavez Memorial Committee of Pinal County.

The annual Cesar Chavez dinner commemorates the legacy and values of the civil rights leader and labor activist. A portion of the proceeds raised at the annual dinner fund the Hispanic Leadership Institute-Pinal scholarship program.

## Police Partner with Union Pacific to Reduce Rail Road Crossing Accidents

Local police officers, along with special agents and police officers of Union Pacific are working together to educate the public and enforce the newest laws in regard to grade crossing safety.



In September, Governor Brewer signed a bill that allows law enforcement to cite drivers and pedestrians who proceed through, around, over or under a crossing gate or barrier at a railroad crossing while the gate or barrier is in use.

Train crews frequently report near misses of trains and vehicles or pedestrians. Although there has not been a grade crossing collision in Casa Grande since 2010, police caution drivers and pedestrians against making hasty decisions to try to "beat" the train.

### Here are some safety tips for drivers and pedestrians:

- Follow all traffic laws
- Be patient
- Observe all warning signs at grade crossings, including signs, flashing lights and gates.
- Don't try to "beat" the train. A train takes a long time to slow down or stop and weighs much more than you or your vehicle. The consequences can be fatal.

## Casa Grande Police Officer Saves Life of Injured Pedestrian

Casa Grande police officer Brian McCloskey was recently recognized for his efforts in helping save the life of an injured pedestrian. The incident happened on September 29 just after midnight when a 33-year-old man was struck by a vehicle on North Pinal Avenue just south of Korstsen Road. Officer McCloskey was the first on the scene and quickly began to perform CPR on the man who was unresponsive and not breathing. Because of his quick response and action the pedestrian began to breathe and eventually gained consciousness. Shortly after, medical crews arrived and took over care of the man who was flown to Maricopa Medical Center in Phoenix for further examination.

Police Chief Johnny Cervantes said, "Officer McCloskey acted without hesitation and concern for his own safety to help the injured pedestrian. Due to his extraordinary efforts, we are proud to have him be part of our team and will honor him with a Life Saving Award."

## Casa Grande Fire Department Reminds Residents to Prevent Kitchen Fires



According to the latest research from the National Fire Protection Association, cooking is the leading cause of home fires. Two of every five home fires begin in the kitchen - that's more than any other place in the home. Cooking fires are also the leading cause of home fire-related injuries.



### Here are some safety tips to prevent fires in the kitchen:

- Stay in the kitchen when you are frying, grilling, broiling, or boiling food.
- If you must leave the room, even for a short period of time, turn off the stove.
- When you are simmering, baking, or roasting food, check it regularly, stay in the home, and use a timer to remind you.
- If you have young children, use the stove's back burners whenever possible. Keep children and pets at least three feet away from the stove.
- When you cook, wear clothing with tight-fitting sleeves.
- Keep pot holders, oven mitts, wooden utensils, paper and plastic bags, towels, and anything else that can burn away from your stovetop.
- Clean up food and grease from burners and stovetops.

## Help Fight Sewer Backups

Sewer backups damage City infrastructure, create health hazards and threaten the natural environment.

You can avoid backups by following a few basic guidelines:

- Oil or grease residue should be poured, wiped, or scraped from plates, pots and pans and disposed of with household solid waste or garbage.
- Garbage disposals should be used wisely and sparingly, and never for the disposal of household generated oils, greases, or grease bearing food products.
- Remember that food such as gravies, frostings, and dressings can contain significant quantities of oils and fats.

## Tree-Cycle Your Christmas Tree

The Sanitation Division will collect expired Christmas trees for recycling at nine (9) Tree-Cycle sites located throughout the city. Tree-Cycle containers will be made available to the public from December 23 through January 10. All collection containers will be marked with signs labeled "Christmas Tree Recycling."

- Pearl Rd. and Cottonwood Ln.** (North West corner).
- Villago Park:** 3368 N. Pinal Ave. (North East corner of parking lot).
- Rotary Park:** 2220 N. Trezell Rd. (South end of park parking lot).
- Ed Hooper Rodeo Park:** 2525 N. Pinal Ave. (South East corner of Pinal Ave. and Rodeo Rd.)
- City of Casa Grande Landfill:** 5200 S. Chui Chu Rd.



**NOTE:** Please remember to remove nails, tinsel, tree stands, lights and decorations before recycling. Wreaths (with décor left on them) and artificial trees cannot be recycled. These items need to be placed in the regular trash container for disposal.

Christmas trees will be chipped at the landfill and made available to the public to use as mulch for no fee. Residents requesting to receive the mulch must bring necessary tools to load and haul the tree chippings.
