


Christmas Tree Recycling Drop-Off Locations

The City of Casa Grande Sanitation Division will collect expired Christmas trees for recycling at nine (9) Tree-Cycle sites located throughout the City. Tree-Cycle containers will be made available to the public from December 26th through January 8th. All collection containers will be marked with signs labeled "Christmas Tree Recycling".

Tree Cycle Drop-Off Locations

1. Carr McNatt Park: 1115 N. Casa Grande Ave. (South West parking lot of Casa Grande Ave. and 10th St).
2. Trekell Rd. and Palm Park Blvd. (South West corner onto the empty lot).
3. 6th St. and Trekell Rd. (Center of property).
4. Schultz St. and O'Neil Dr. (South East corner).
5. Peart Rd. and Cottonwood Ln. (800 feet North of Cottonwood Ln., East side of Peart Road).
6. Villago Park: 3368 N. Pinal Ave. (North East corner of parking lot).
7. Rotary Park: 2220 N. Trekell Rd. (South end of parking lot).
8. Ed Hooper Rodeo Park: 2525 N. Pinal Ave. (North West corner of Pinal Ave. and Rodeo Rd.)
9. City of Casa Grande Landfill: 5200 S. Chui Chu Rd. (Please inform the gate attendant that you have a Christmas tree to recycle and you will be directed to the drop off location onsite).



Christmas trees will be chipped at the landfill (5200 S. Chui Chu Rd.) and made available, at no fee, to the public to use as mulch. Residents requesting to receive the mulch are asked to bring necessary equipment to load and haul the tree chippings.



Help Reduce Pet Overpopulation: Spay or Neuter Your Pet for FREE!

The Arizona Companion Animal Spay and Neuter Committee awarded the City of Casa Grande Animal Care & Adoption Center a \$10,000 grant to assist with spay and neuter surgery costs. This is the fourth year the City has been awarded this grant. The grant funds were made available from the support and sales of the Arizona Companion Animal Spay and Neuter Pet Friendly License Plates.

The "Driving Force" For Fighting Pet Overpopulation

Residents who live in the Casa Grande city limits can apply to spay or neuter their pets at no cost. Only two pets per household are eligible. Pets must be at least three months old and have a current rabies vaccination. A rabies vaccination certificate must be presented or one will be provided at the time of the surgery at a cost of \$10.

Pet owners who are interested in participating in the program must fill out an application to receive a voucher. Application forms are available at the Finance Office (510 E. Florence Blvd., Building B) or by calling the Animal Care & Adoption Center at (520) 426-9300. The voucher only covers the cost of the spay or neuter. The pet owner has no obligation to receive additional services other than the rabies vaccination. Once applications have been submitted, staff will call within a week to schedule a surgery date.

The Animal Care & Adoption Center will continue to give out spay and neuter vouchers to residents who live in the Casa Grande city limits until grant money is depleted.

Parks and Recreation Launches Adopt-a-Trail Program

The Parks and Recreation Department has developed an Adopt-a-Trail Program so volunteers can adopt trail sections to assist with maintaining, enhancing and monitoring the trails and trailhead at Casa Grande Mountain.

Who Can Adopt a Trail?

Anyone with an interest in trails and the outdoors is welcome to participate. Individuals, families, businesses, community and service organizations, churches, schools and scout troops are all examples of volunteers. Individuals under 16 years of age, however, must be accompanied by an adult.

Why Should You Participate?

Adopting a trail section provides an opportunity for you to be actively involved in conservation and preservation. Helping to maintain and enhance the trails improves the resource for all to enjoy. The effort brings trail and nature enthusiasts closer to the environment and their community. Volunteers will enjoy the time they spend outdoors and the personal satisfaction gained through volunteerism.

What Do Volunteers Do?

Adopt-A-Trail volunteers assist park maintenance staff in maintaining the trail system, including:

- Keeping the trail surface free of sticks, rocks and other debris
- Pruning small limbs from the trail corridor
- Cleaning debris from trails and trailhead
- Litter clean-up
- Cleaning water bars and drainage ditches
- Reporting erosion problems, suspicious or illegal activities, vandalism and safety issues
