
Mayor Bob Jackson

New Pedestrian Crosswalk on Pinal Avenue

Children who live on the west side of Pinal Avenue and walk to school across the road now have a safer way of crossing the busy roadway. The Arizona Department of Transportation installed a pedestrian hybrid beacon on Pinal Avenue at the San Carlos Trail school crossing to help students and other pedestrians cross the busy street safely.

The crosswalk is a pedestrian-activated warning device that assists pedestrians in crossing a street at a marked, but unsignaled, crosswalk using a system of warning and flashing lights to notify and stop traffic.

Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon Steps for Activation

When there is no pedestrian waiting to cross, drivers will see that all indication lights are dark and the pedestrian will see a "DON'T WALK" symbol. A pedestrian who wants to cross the street will need to push the button to cross.

When a pedestrian pushes the button to cross, approaching drivers will see a **FLASHING YELLOW** for a few seconds indicating that they should reduce speed and be prepared to stop for a pedestrian in the crosswalk. Pedestrians will continue to see a "DON'T WALK" symbol and should wait.

Drivers will see a **STEADY YELLOW**, warning drivers the indication will soon turn to **STEADY RED**. Pedestrians will continue to see the "DON'T WALK" symbol and should continue to wait.

Drivers will see a **STEADY RED** light which will require them to **STOP** at the stop line. At this point, the pedestrian receives a **WALK** indication to cross.

As the pedestrian crosses the street, drivers will see **ALTERNATING FLASHING RED** lights, indicating that they need to stop. During this period, motorists are required to **STOP** or remain stopped until pedestrians have finished crossing the street, and then may proceed with caution. Pedestrians will see a flashing countdown which indicates how much time they have to cross the street.

At the end of the flashing countdown indication, drivers will see that all indication lights are dark and the pedestrian will see a "DON'T WALK" symbol. Drivers may continue to proceed through the crosswalk if it is clear and pedestrians waiting to cross will have to push the button to cross.

The app, called **mycasagrande**, allows citizens to report potholes, graffiti and other service issues. The app works on both Android and Apple devices. We encourage you to download the free app to report issues.

City of Casa Grande Maintains 'AA' Bond Rating

Fitch Ratings reviewed the City of Casa Grande's financial information in January 2014 and concluded that the City's overall financial outlook is stable. The credit agency affirmed the 'AA' rating based on existing general obligation bonds.

This rating means that the City can secure financing at lower interest rates, as there is much less risk that the money will not be repaid. Similar to how individuals get lower interest rates based on their credit score, the City also has to prove its financial ability to repay any debt.

"While other cities in the state are being downgraded, we've been fortunate to keep our bond rating strong," said City Manager Jim Thompson. "This rating demonstrates our commitment to being responsible with public funds to make the biggest impact for the community."

Although still recovering from the economic downturn, the City has maintained a moderately paced economic recovery the last few years. In their summary of the City of Casa Grande's obligations, Fitch Ratings noted that the City has increased levels of residential development activity, consumer spending and local commercial investment.

The agency also noted that City management "prudently accumulated a portion of the large excise tax revenue gains made in earlier growth years, particularly local construction sales tax revenues, and dedicated much of it towards future, one-time capital spending rather than expanding ongoing spending levels."

Help Prevent Domestic Violence

As of November 2013, an estimated 115 domestic violence-related fatalities were reported in Arizona, some occurring in the Casa Grande area. When the term “domestic violence” is used, oftentimes we think of physical abuse, but domestic violence is not just physical abuse. Arizona Revised Statute 13-3601 (statute that defines domestic violence) lists approximately 20 plus crimes that fall under the domestic violence umbrella. Several of these crimes can occur with no physical contact at all.

Domestic violence related crimes are preventable and the Casa Grande Police Department is committed to ensuring the safety of our citizens, but we need your help! If you know of a relative, friend, co-worker, etc. involved in a domestic violence relationship the best thing you can do is encourage that person to report the behavior or report the behavior yourself if they aren't willing.

Learn How to Properly Use Alarms to Avoid False Alarms

Each year false alarms cost all of us millions of dollars and thousands of wasted man hours.

Properly installed, used, and maintained, security alarms are a real asset to homeowners because they help protect lives and property. In Casa Grande, all residents who operate a security alarm system are required to have a permit.

The Casa Grande Police Department offers FREE classes to residents interested in learning more about how to properly use their security alarm system. The instructor will explain how fees are assessed for false alarms, how police officers respond to false alarms, how to properly cancel false alarms, and how to avoid false alarms.



All who attend receive a \$50 waiver certificate toward their false alarm cost recovery fees. Waiver certificate expires one year from issue date. One per year allowed. One certificate per address. Non-transferable. Must have a valid permit at the time of registration. Only one class is required.

FAST FACT In Casa Grande, all residents who operate a security alarm system are required to have a permit.

Fall Prevention Tips For Older Adults

- Exercise regularly. Talk to your primary care physician and achieve approval regarding the best exercises for you. A healthy walk and appropriate stretching can often be the strongest fall prevention measures. Exercise does NOT have to involve weights or machines! Exercise does NOT have to cost money! Maintain your independence and quality of life!

- Take your time. Anticipate your movements fully before acting upon them. Sit up to the edge of your seat or bed for several moments. Allow your body to catch up with your plans. Stand and gain your balance before you walk. While standing still; look around at all of your surroundings. This is only a ten to fifteen second process and you should actively practice it so it becomes routine. It is a three phase process of getting up. Be sure and respect each phase individually. Our hearts and minds will always out run the rest of our body!

- Clear the way. Keep your frequently walked areas and pathways free of cords, shoes, clothing, books, magazines, and other clutter. Staying organized can prevent thousands of dollars in medical bills and months of stressful recovery!

- Look out for yourself. Make sure any corrective lenses have a current prescription. Use plug in night lights in high traffic areas. Light up the darkness! Make sure the trafficked areas outside your home are lit up as well. (i.e. Pathways to mailboxes, clubhouses, patios, and dumpsters.) Team up and make your neighborhood and community safer together!

- Put your best foot forward. Good footwear is paramount! Wear sturdy, well-fitted, low-heeled, non-slip soled shoes. Slippers, flip-flops, socks, and bare feet contribute heavily to fall injuries. Stand up and defend your way of life, starting with a good foothold!


