INSTRUCTIONS:

- *What is a motion?* A motion is a request to the Court to make a certain decision about a case.
- *Who can file a motion?* Usually, only someone who is a party in a case can file a motion.
- *Who is a party to a case?* In criminal cases, the parties are the Plaintiff and the Defendants.
- *Who is the Plaintiff?* The Plaintiff is the one who files charges. In criminal cases, it is the State.
- *Who is the Defendant?* The Defendant is the one whom the Plaintiff has filed charges against.
- *What can I ask for in my motion?* You can ask for any relief that is allowed under the law.

Common examples include motions to reschedule a court appearance, quash a warrant, modify release conditions, modify terms of probation, or vacate a default judgment in a civil traffic case.
