



Pre-Application Process

Prior to the submittal of an application for a Major Site Plan/PAD Final Development Plan or a Major Amendment to an approved Major Site Plan/PAD Final Development Plan the applicant is required to hold a Pre-Application meeting with the Planner to review the application submittal requirements, processing steps and timelines. During the pre-application stage the applicant's proposal may be scheduled for a Development Team Meeting which will allow other appropriate City/outside agency review staff to provide the applicant comments and guidance on the proposed development. The applicant should bring the following information to the pre-application meeting:

- I. Project Narrative indicating the following:
 - a. Applicant information
 - b. Description of proposed development
 - c. Other information the applicant believes may be useful to allow City/Agency Staff to familiarize themselves with the project.
2. Conceptual Site Plan drawn at a readable size and scale indicating the following:
 - a. Proposed site boundaries & lot configurations
 - b. Proposed building footprints & land uses
 - c. Proposed access, parking & circulation
 - d. Proposed utility services
 - e. Proposed drainage facilities
 - f. Special site conditions

Submittal Package

Applications for a new Major Site Plan/PAD Final Development Plan, or Major Amendment to a previously approved Major Site Plan/PAD Final Development Plan shall be accompanied by the following plans that will be reviewed by City Staff and presented to the Planning and Zoning Commission for Final Approval (17.68.310. A.3, 4 & 5):

- a. **Project Narrative**
- b. **Site Plan:**

- (1) Name of project
- (2) Date of plan preparation including subsequent revisions
- (3) North point indicator
- (4) Scale of not less than 1" to 50' for Residential (*for addressing purposes*)
- (5) Scale of not less than 1" to 100' feet for Commercial (*for addressing purposes*)
- (6) Vicinity map
- (7) Site statistics (in table form), indicating the following:
 - i. Zoning & proposed use;
 - ii. General Plan Classification;
 - iii. Site area net & gross (show in acres and square feet);
 - iv. Total building area (square feet);
 - v. Total number of required and provided parking spaces including bike racks and handicap parking spaces;
 - vi. Percent of site building coverage
 - vii. Dwelling unit # and density (if condominium or high density housing project);
- (8) Adjacent zoning districts
- (9) Dimensioned site boundary and any proposed new lot configurations
- (10) Buildings and structures
- (11) Setbacks (*Building and parking*)
- (12) Fences and walls
- (13) Detached signage
- (14) Exterior refuse collection areas
- (15) Exterior lighting including cut sheets
- (16) Parking, internal circulation, loading areas and access details



- (17) Provision for handicapped accessibility, including but not limited to wheelchair ramps, parking spaces, hand rails, and curb openings in accordance with A.R.S. 34-404 through 34-439
 - (18) Existing and proposed public and private sidewalks/walkways, multi-use and pedestrian trails
 - (19) Existing and proposed streets improvements, a distance of one hundred fifty feet, except for sites adjacent to major arterial streets where the distances shall be two hundred feet, giving widths, preliminary curve data
 - (20) Existing and proposed right-of-way dedications
 - (21) Significant natural features and existing vegetation
- c. Preliminary Landscape Plan** (May be provided as a stand alone drawing or illustrated on the site plan)
- (1) Date of plan preparation including subsequent revisions
 - (2) Scale, north arrow, and dimensions
 - (3) Vicinity map
 - (4) Property lines, alleys, private streets, tracts and adjacent right-of-ways
 - (5) Site visibility triangles
 - (6) Landscape statistics (in table form), indicating the following:
 - (7) Amount of net site area
 - (8) Ground floor area of all buildings
 - (9) Number of required and proposed parking spaces
 - (10) Amount of all proposed landscape areas (required and provided)
 - (11) The location and identification of all proposed landscape areas (on-site, street right-of-way, parking area, landscape buffers and others)
 - (12) The approximate location of all existing and proposed trees, shrubs, and other landscape materials and improvements
 - (13) The location, height, type, and general design and finish of all proposed screening walls
 - (14) The location of all proposed storm water drainage and retention areas
 - (15) Notes or graphical representations adequately showing the intent of the proposed plan and materials, and indicating how the plans will comply with the Landscape Code.
 - (16) Notes or graphic indications of the proposed type of irrigation system, water source, pressure and supply outlet.
- d. Conceptual Architectural Elevations/Renderings**
- (1) Date of preparation including dates of any subsequent revisions
 - (2) Building dimensions
 - (3) Gross square footage of existing and proposed structures
 - (4) Front, rear and side elevations, with a description of exterior materials, lighting, and colors to be used
 - (5) Height above mean sea level of the lowest floor when the structure is proposed to be located in a floodway or floodplain area
 - (6) Show screen wall/fence/trash enclosure elevations
- e. Preliminary Grading & Drainage Plan meeting the requirements of code section 15.40.1230**

- f. Preliminary Utility Plan**
- 1) Preliminary layout of the water service system indicating fire hydrants, valves, meter vaults, water line sizes, and connection to the water main network
 - 2) Preliminary layout of the wastewater service lines and connection to the public system
- g. Traffic Impact Analysis** meeting the requirements of the City of Casa Grande Small Area Transportation Plan Section 7.4. A waiver to the Traffic Impact Analysis requirement maybe granted upon submittal of a Trip Generation Estimate (prepared by a qualified professional) that indicates the new development will not result in 100 or more trips per average weekday.
- h. Preliminary Drainage/Hydrology Report** meeting the requirements of code section 15.40.1260

Public Notice

- 1) Newspaper Notice- City staff will prepare the Notice of Public Hearing.
- 2) Sign Posting- The applicant must post a Notice of Public Hearing Sign at least fifteen (15) calendar days prior to the date of the public hearing. City Staff will provide the applicant with sign posting instructions 21 days prior to the hearing. *Said sign must be removed from the site no later than 10 days after the last applicable public hearing. The City offers a sign removal service for a fee (if desired check the box below). For additional public notice sign posting instructions go to (<http://casagrandeaz.gov/dept/planning/planning-division/public-process/>)*
- 3) Surrounding Property Owner Notification - City Staff will prepare and mail all required notices to surrounding property owners.

Appeal Rights:

- 1) Denial of a Major Site Plan by the Planning Commission may be appealed by the applicant to the City Council within 10 days of the Commission's decision. Said appeal shall be placed on the next available City Council agenda and Council shall consider oral or written statements from the applicant, city staff, the public, and its own members (17.68.070.E)

¹All times are maximum timeframes in business days (Mon-Fri.; excluding City Holidays). Shorter review times will be accomplished where possible.

²Completeness Review timeframes are calculated from date of application submittal to date of acceptance or rejection of the application as administratively complete.

³Substantive Review timeframes are calculated from date of acceptance of application for Substantive Review, or upon receipt of re-submittal of revised plans/reports, to the date of issuance of a comprehensive review letter, or final administrative decision.

⁴ Review of initial submittal limited to determination of compliance with ordinances, codes, regulations or policy relevant to the specific permit or project application. The review comments on the initial submittal may be amended to address code/policy requirements that City staff failed to include in the 1st comprehensive review document.

⁵ Review of resubmittal shall be limited to:

- a) Addressing 1st review comments that the applicant failed to adequately address in their resubmittal; or
- b) Addressing new review issues arising from modifications the applicant has made to the design and/or technical reports. In this case the City may issue an additional review letter addressing the new design.

⁶Over-All Review timeframe is the sum of the Completeness, Initial & Resubmittal Substantive Review timeframes.

⁷ If an applicant requests significant changes, alterations, additions or amendments to an application that are not in response to the request for corrections, the City may make **one additional comprehensive written request for corrections (i.e., review of 2nd resubmittal)**. Said additional request for correction shall not exceed 50% of the Substantive Review time frame for the specific type of permit.

⁸The Substantive Review timeframe and the Overall Review timeframe may be extended by mutual consent of the applicant and the City. Said extension shall not exceed 50% of the Over-All timeframe.

⁹Indicates that the Project will require a public hearing and Board/Commission and/or City Council approval. For these Projects the Substantive Review period ends when staff schedules the application for the public hearing and Board/Commission/City Council action.



In accordance with the Regulatory Bill of Rights (ARS 9-835) the City of Casa Grande will typically make an administrative decision on each permit application after one (1) comprehensive staff review. However, from time to time a 2nd review is necessary to resolve code/policy compliance issues associated with a permit. In accordance with ARS 9-835.1., by mutual agreement, the applicant and the City may engage in a 2nd review of an application as long as said 2nd review does not exceed the over-all time frame by 50%. The specific 1st and 2nd and over-all review timeframes for this application are provided above. Applicants may sign below, consenting to a 2nd review if necessary, within the stated prescribed timeframe. Your consent is not required at time of application submittal. Applicants who do not sign below will be contacted by City staff if a 2nd review is determined to be necessary prior to making an administrative decision on this application. Applications denied after the completion of the review cycle are eligible for re-application to address the code/policy deficiencies which were the basis for the application denial with the payment of a fee equal to 25% of original application fee amount. Said re-application shall occur within 90 days of the application denial.




Administrative Completeness Review Process




Substantive Review Process
