Chief's Message — Chief Mark McCrory

The Importance of Reporting All Crimes

As the Chief of Police for the City of Casa Grande, I want to address an issue that directly impacts the safety and well-being of our community: the importance of reporting crimes, no matter how minor they may seem. Whether it's a vehicle burglary where the loss is minimal, or a seemingly insignificant act of vandalism, every crime matters, and so does every report made by our citizens.



One common misconception is that certain crimes, like vehicle break-ins where nothing of great value is stolen, are too trivial to report. However, I want to emphasize that every single crime report plays a crucial role in maintaining public safety and helping us understand crime trends in our city. Here are some key reasons why reporting all crimes, regardless of their perceived severity, is vital to our collective efforts in building a safer Casa Grande:

1. Crime Trends and Resource Allocation

When crimes go unreported, our department is left with an incomplete picture of the criminal activity in our neighborhoods. Even small incidents, such as a car burglary or property damage, contribute to an overall understanding of crime trends. This data is essential because it allows us to pinpoint "hot spots" where criminal activity is concentrated, identify patterns, and allocate resources effectively. Without your reports, our ability to prevent future crimes or catch those responsible becomes much more challenging.

2. Linking Crimes and Identifying Offenders

Vehicle burglaries, for instance, might seem minor on their own, but they often occur in patterns or clusters. A series of car break-ins in one area could indicate a larger crime spree. Reporting these incidents, even when the loss is minimal, could provide us with the crucial information we need to solve not just your case, but others as well. A single reported vehicle burglary could be the key piece of evidence that helps us identify a repeat offender or connect them to other, more significant crimes.

3. Preventing Escalation

Often, criminals start small. A person who commits a minor vehicle burglary today could be emboldened by the lack of consequences and escalate to more serious offenses in the future. By reporting every crime, you help ensure that offenders are identified and held accountable early, preventing them from moving on to more damaging criminal behavior.

4. Insurance and Recovery

For those who experience theft or damage, reporting the crime is often necessary for insurance claims. Even if the value of the items stolen is low, having a police report on file ensures you have the proper documentation if the need arises. Additionally, by reporting the incident, you increase the chances of recovering your stolen property. Our officers often recover stolen items, and having a detailed record on file can significantly improve our ability to return those belongings to you.

5. Community Engagement and Trust

When citizens report crimes, it fosters a sense of partnership between the police department and the community. We rely on your eyes and ears to keep our city safe. By taking the time to report even minor crimes, you show your commitment to protecting your neighborhood. This partnership is essential to the success of our mission to serve and protect every resident of Casa Grande. The stronger our connection with the community, the more effective we can be at keeping everyone safe.

6. Deterrence

One of the strongest deterrents to crime is the knowledge that law enforcement is vigilant and engaged. When criminals know that even minor offenses like vehicle burglaries are taken seriously and reported by citizens, it can discourage them from targeting our neighborhoods. A community that actively reports crimes sends a clear message that lawlessness will not be tolerated.

7. Improving Public Safety

Ultimately, reporting all crimes is about improving public safety for everyone in Casa Grande. Every report adds to our ability to solve crimes, prevent future incidents, and ensure that our community remains a safe place to live, work, and raise a family.

As your Chief of Police, I encourage every citizen to take an active role in reporting crimes, regardless of how insignificant they may appear. Our department is committed to using the information you provide to make Casa Grande a safer place for all of us. Remember, no crime is too small to report. Your involvement helps us serve you better.

Don't let the Grinch steal your holiday spirit! — Officer Thomas Anderson

The holiday season is a time for celebration, family gatherings, and shopping for those special gifts. With the increase in activity at local stores and shopping centers in Casa Grande during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons, it's also a prime opportunity for criminals to target unattended vehicles. The Casa Grande Police Department wants to remind everyone to take extra precautions to secure their vehicles and belongings while enjoying the holiday shopping experience.

Follow these important safety tips to help prevent theft and protect your property during the busy holiday season.

1. Lock It Up

- **Always lock your doors:** It may seem simple, but locking your vehicle is the first line of defense against theft. Even if you're making a quick stop, take the extra moment to lock your car.
- **Roll up windows:** Ensure all windows are completely closed before leaving your vehicle, even if you're just running into the store for a few minutes.
- **Double-check locks:** If your vehicle has remote locking, confirm that the doors have locked by listening for the beep or looking for visual confirmation, such as the flashing lights.



2. Keep Valuables Out of Sight

- **Remove or hide valuables:** Never leave items like electronics, shopping bags, purses, or wallets visible in your car. Thieves are more likely to break in if they see something valuable inside. Place valuable items in the trunk, glove compartment, or under the seat before you arrive at your destination.
- **Use a car trunk or covered storage:** If your vehicle has a trunk, use it to store your purchases and other valuables. For SUVs or other vehicles without trunks, consider using a cargo cover to conceal your belongings.
- **Take your keys:** Never leave your keys inside your vehicle, even if you're just stepping away for a short time. Thieves can easily take advantage of an unlocked car with the keys still inside.

3. Park Smart

- **Choose well-lit areas:** When parking at a shopping center or store, always choose a spot in a well-lit area. Thieves are less likely to target vehicles in visible and well-lit locations.
- **Avoid secluded spots:** If possible, park near store entrances or areas with a lot of foot traffic. Criminals tend to avoid busy areas where they are more likely to be seen.
- **Stay alert in parking lots:** Be aware of your surroundings when entering or leaving parking lots, and don't hesitate to ask for assistance from store personnel or security if you feel uncomfortable.

4. Be Aware of Keyless Entry Vulnerabilities

- **Watch for signal jamming:** Some criminals use signal jammers to interfere with key fobs, preventing your vehicle from locking. Always manually check that your car is locked before leaving the area, especially if you use a remote keyless entry system.
- **Block key fob signals:** Keyless entry systems can be vulnerable to relay attacks, where criminals capture the signal from your key fob to unlock your car. To prevent this, consider keeping your key fob in a signal-blocking pouch (Faraday pouch) when not in use.

5. Don't Leave Vehicles Running

- **Avoid warming up your car unattended:** During the cooler months, many people warm up their vehicles by leaving them running in parking lots. Unfortunately, this is an open invitation for car theft. Never leave your car running or unlocked, even for a short time.



6. Be Mindful of Shopping Bags

- **Don't leave purchases in plain view:** After a round of shopping, it's tempting to drop off bags in your car before continuing, but avoid leaving shopping bags visible inside the vehicle. If you need to drop items off, lock them in the trunk, and if possible, move your car to a different location afterward to make it less obvious.
- **Consolidate purchases:** Instead of making frequent trips to the car, consider consolidating your shopping bags before heading to your vehicle. The less you move between the store and the parking lot, the lower the chances of a thief spotting your movements.

7. Report Suspicious Activity

- **Stay vigilant:** Keep an eye out for suspicious behavior in parking lots. If you notice anyone lingering near vehicles, trying door handles, or acting strangely, report it to store security or the Casa Grande Police Department.
- **Call the police:** If you observe any suspicious activity or feel that your safety is at risk, don't hesitate to contact the Casa Grande Police Department. In emergencies, call 911; for non-emergencies, use our non-emergency number: (520) 421-8700.

8. Use Anti-Theft Devices

- **Consider a steering wheel lock:** A visible anti-theft device, such as a steering wheel lock, can deter thieves from targeting your car.
- **Vehicle tracking systems:** If your car has a GPS tracking system or if you're considering adding one, it can be invaluable in the event of a theft by helping authorities locate your vehicle quickly.

9. Secure Your Garage Opener

- **Keep garage openers out of sight:** Garage door openers left in vehicles can provide criminals with easy access to your home. Always remove the opener or hide it when parking in public places.

New Year's Eve is cause for celebration! But, safety first... – Officer Thomas Anderson

As the year comes to a close, New Year's Eve is a time for celebration, reflection, and looking forward to the future. However, while festivities can be fun, they can also pose significant safety risks if not approached responsibly. The City of Casa Grande Police Department is committed to ensuring that everyone in our community rings in the New Year safely. This advisory will focus on responsible fireworks use, the dangers of illegally discharging firearms, and how you can help maintain a safe environment for all.

1. Fireworks Safety and Regulations

While fireworks are a traditional part of New Year's Eve celebrations, it's important to remember that not all fireworks are legal, and even legal ones can be dangerous if used improperly.

Know the Law



- **Legal fireworks:** In Arizona, only certain types of fireworks are legal for consumer use. Typically, ground-based fireworks like sparklers, smoke devices, and fountains are permitted. However, aerial fireworks, firecrackers, and bottle rockets are illegal for personal use.
- **Check local ordinances:** While the state has set guidelines, cities like Casa Grande may have additional regulations regarding the use of fireworks. Check with the City of Casa Grande for the latest information on permissible fireworks during the New Year's Eve holiday.
- **Designated timeframes:** Legal fireworks can only be used during specific time periods. In most cases, fireworks are allowed on December 31 and January 1, but use outside these dates may result in fines.

Safety Tips for Fireworks

- **Keep a safe distance:** Only use fireworks in open areas, away from people, homes, dry vegetation, and vehicles. Maintain a safe distance from the fireworks after lighting them.
- **Supervise children:** Fireworks, even sparklers, can be dangerous for young children. Always have an adult present and never allow children to handle or light fireworks.
- **Have water nearby:** In case of a fire, keep a bucket of water or a hose nearby to extinguish any flames immediately.
- **Follow instructions:** Only use fireworks according to the manufacturer's instructions, and never attempt to alter or combine fireworks.
- **Dispose of fireworks properly:** After fireworks are done, soak them in water before disposing of them in a metal trash container to prevent accidental fires.

2. Dangers of Illegal Firearms Discharge

While many celebrate New Year's Eve with fireworks, it is critical to stress that discharging firearms into the air is not only illegal but also extremely dangerous. What goes up must come down, and bullets fired into the air can travel long distances before striking the ground with deadly force.

Legal Consequences

- **Discharging a firearm in city limits:** Firing a gun within city limits is illegal and is a serious offense. This includes celebratory gunfire during holidays like New Year's Eve. Violators can face criminal charges, hefty fines, and jail time.
- **Endangering lives:** Bullets fired into the air can strike people, homes, and vehicles, causing injury, death, and property damage. Even if you can't see where the bullet lands, it poses a significant risk to those around you.

—

- **Shannon's Law:** Named after a young Arizona girl who was tragically killed by a stray bullet, Shannon's Law makes it a felony to discharge a firearm within city limits. This law underscores the severe consequences of celebratory gunfire.

Safety Tips for Firearm Owners

- **Celebrate safely:** If you own a firearm, celebrate responsibly by keeping your weapon secured and avoiding any temptation to discharge it. Firearms should never be part of holiday celebrations.
- **Report illegal gunfire:** Fireworks can often be mistaken for gunshots. If you hear gunshots or suspect someone is discharging a firearm in your area, contact the Casa Grande Police Department immediately. Provide as much information as possible, including location and description, to help us respond quickly.

3. General New Year's Eve Safety Tips

In addition to the risks posed by fireworks and firearms, New Year's Eve can present other safety challenges, especially in the context of large gatherings, alcohol consumption, and busy roads.

Stay Safe on the Roads

- **Don't drink and drive:** The risk of impaired driving increases on New Year's Eve due to alcohol consumption. Always designate a sober driver or use a ride-sharing service if you plan to drink. Remember, driving under the influence puts your life and the lives of others in serious danger.
- **Watch for pedestrians:** Many people may be walking to and from parties or public events. Be extra cautious while driving, especially near bars, restaurants, and residential areas.
- **Plan your night:** If you plan to attend parties, make sure you have a transportation plan in place before you start drinking. Stay overnight at a friend's house if necessary to avoid the risks of impaired driving.

Be Mindful of Noise and Pets

- **Fireworks and pets:** Fireworks can be distressing for pets, causing them to run away or injure themselves. Keep pets indoors during fireworks displays and create a calming environment with soothing music or a quiet space.
